EE29. REPORT BACK ON THE CONSULTATION ON PROPOSED SITE FOR NEW CARRONGRANGE SCHOOL

The Education Executive considered a report by the joint Acting Director of Education which (a) advised that at the meeting of the Education Executive held on 27 August 2013, it had been agreed that formal statutory consultation take place on the proposal to relocate Carrongrange School at one of two proposed sites; (b) noted that the consultation had taken place between 28 August and 11 October 2013; (c) provided details of the responses received during the consultation, and (d) recommended a preferred location for the new school.

The sites which had been identified by the Site Selection Team were land alongside Moray Primary School in Grangemouth and at Weedingshall in Polmont. The report outlined the detail of the consultation which included a summary of the consultation responses and the conclusion from the consultation. Also included in the report was information on Education Services vision for the new school.

No clear preference had emerged during the consultation process. The recommendation from Education Services was, however, that the site at Moray Primary School offered better scope to meet the terms of the vision which had been outlined for the new school.

Decision

The Education Executive agreed to:-

- (1) note the content and responses contained within the Consultation Report, and
- (2) endorse Education Services' view that the new Carrongrange School is located on the site adjacent to Moray Primary School.
