1. Purpose of Report

1.1 The purpose of this report is to update Council on the outcome of the consultation process undertaken to identify and agree new and/or alternative polling places, if required, and to propose amendments to the Falkirk Council polling scheme as a consequence of the Local Boundary Commission for Scotland's 5th Review of Electoral Arrangements.

2. Recommendation(s)

2.1 It is recommended that Council approves the polling scheme appended hereto, subject to the polling stations at polling district FW611 changing from Mobile Unit – Co-op Car Park to New Unit 2, The Carron Centre, with immediate effect for the purpose of the local government elections on 4 May 2017 and until the next full review of polling places to be held between 1 October 2018 and 31 January 2020, subject to any individual changes required in the interim period.

3. Background

3.1 Council considered a report on 7 December 2016 updating on the interim amendments made to the Falkirk Council polling scheme as a consequence of the Local Boundary Commission for Scotland's 5th Review of Electoral Arrangements and outlining proposals for further changes to the scheme in relation to polling places affected by possible closure. Council noted the revised polling scheme updated prior to the statutory annual publication of electoral registers on 1 December 2016 and agreed to undertake a consultation process to identify and agree new and/or alternative polling places, if required, and to consider a further report on the outcome of the consultation process before the nomination period for the local government elections on 4 May 2017.

4. Considerations

4.1 The new ward boundaries required no changes to polling places. The previous polling scheme was therefore amended to reflect the amended boundaries only, with the focus then being on any polling places (community halls primarily) which might not be available. A consultation process was undertaken, as agreed by Council on 7 December 2016, which resulted in no comments being received and no alternative polling places suggested.

In the interim, it has been confirmed that all existing community halls will be available. The polling scheme has, consequently, required minimal change.

- 4.2 Ward 6 Falkirk North, has one polling place in Carron Co-op car park (polling district FW611) in The Carron Centre. The agent for the Co-op advises that there is the potential for development within the car park which would possibly impact on the area where the polling place (two mobile units) is sited. While no definitive response has yet been received from the agent for the Co-op, investigations have been ongoing to find another suitable location within the polling district.
- 4.3 A positive and seemingly viable option has been proposed by Lidl UK, who also have premises in the Carron Centre. A shop unit formerly used by "Cash for Clothes" is currently vacant and has been offered to the Council for use as a polling place on 4 May 2017. New Unit 2, The Carron Centre, is 64m², comprises two rooms and a toilet facility and has direct access from the Lidl/Greggs car park. A site visit of the premises will take place on 15 February and an update on the viability of the proposal will be given to local Members before the meeting of Council on 22 February. If suitable, it would be preferable to use these premises in May 2017 rather than bring mobile units onto the Co-op ground at a financial cost.

5. Consultation

5.1 Notice of the consultation process was publicised in the local press (Bo'ness Journal and Falkirk Herald) w/c 12 December 2016. The consultation details were also published on the Council website. No responses to the consultation have been received.

6. Implications

Financial

- 6.1 The use of the Carron Co-op car park for polling purposes has incurred costs of £500 plus VAT per electoral event since it was first used as a polling place in May 2014. If used again in May 2017, it would be expected that the same fee would be applied.
- 6.2 There are no financial implications for the use of New Unit 2 offered by Lidl UK other than ensuring that insurance cover is in place for polling day only.

Resources

6.3 No direct resource implications arise from the content of this report.

Legal

6.4 The Council is required by Section 18 of the Representation of the People Act 1983, as amended by the Electoral Administration Act 2006, to divide its area into polling districts for the purpose of elections and to keep these polling districts under review.

Risk

6.5 If Council agree to the use of New Unit 2, The Carron Centre as detailed above, there would be a requirement for a risk assessment to be undertaken to ensure the premises are suitable for the proposed polling purposes. The Elections Manager will work with the Council's Corporate Risk Co-ordinator to ensure that this exercise is undertaken properly and that the premises are fit for purpose.

Equalities

6.6 No equalities issues arise from the content of this report. It is understood that the premises are accessible to all and would require no remedial works. This will be checked at the site visit on 15 February.

Sustainability/Environmental Impact

6.7 No impact assessment is required.

7. Conclusions

7.1 In the absence of any other identified changes to the current polling scheme, it is proposed that the polling scheme, accepted in principle in December 2016 to reflect the revised electoral ward boundaries, be approved for use at the local government elections in May 2017 and any other electoral events held before the completion of the next full review as referred to at paragraph 2.1 above. It is also considered that the proposed polling place at New Unit 2, The Carron Centre, be added to the polling scheme for polling district FW611, instead of the Mobile Unit – Carron Co-op as currently noted on the polling scheme appended hereto, failing which the possibility of utilising the Co-op car park once again be pursued further.
