1. Applications for the grant of two new taxi driver licences

Mr McFarlane

- 1.1 Mr McFarlane submitted an application for a new taxi driver licence on 19 March 2018. His application must be considered before 18 December 2018. The applicant has failed to pass the knowledge test despite 3 attempts.
- 1.2 Mr McFarlane was invited to sit the test on 5 April 2018 and he attained 78%. He was then invited on 18 April 2018, however he advised that he was unable to attend due to a family bereavement.
- 1.3 Mr McFarlane was invited to sit the test on 3 May 2018, however he was unable to attend as he was unwell. He was invited to site the test on 24 May and he attained 63%. He was then invited to attend on 6 June 2018 and he attained 65%.
- 1.4 Mr McFarlane was then invited to sit the test on 21 June, 5 July and 2 August 2018, however, he advised he was unable to attend. He was invited to sit the test on 16 August 2018, however he advised that he was in hospital and unable to attend. He was invited to sit the test on 30 August 2018 however he did not attend. He was then invited on 20 September 2018 and he did not attend.
- 1.5 It is the view of officers that the applicant has little prospect in passing the knowledge test and would recommend that the Committee consider refusing the application on the basis that he has not passed the knowledge test.
- 1.6 The applicant has not been invited to sit a medical as yet.
- 1.7 Mr McFarlane was notified in a letter of his failure to pass the knowledge test and that the matter would be considered by the Committee. The letter explained he could submit a letter in support of his application which would form part of this report. At the time of preparing this report no letter has been received

Mr Armstrong

- 1.8 Mr Armstrong submitted an application for a new taxi driver licence on 9 July 2018. His application must be considered before 8 April 2019. The applicant has failed to pass the knowledge test despite 4 attempts.
- 1.9 Mr Armstrong was invited to sit the test on 3 August 2018 and he attained 61%. He was then invited on 16 August 2018 and he attained 59%.
- 1.10 Mr Armstrong was then invited to sit the test on 30 August 2018 and he attained 69% He was given a fourth opportunity to site the test on 27 September and he attained 83%.
- 1.11 The applicant has been given the full four opportunities to sit the test and in view of his failure to pass the knowledge test officers would recommend that the Committee consider refusing the application on the basis that he has not passed the knowledge test. That said, it is of note that the applicant missed out on passing the test on his most recent attempt by 2%. In such circumstances and given that the applicant generally shown improvement in each test attempt, Members may wish to give consideration to affording the applicant a fifth and final attempt to pass the test.
- 1.12 The applicant has not been invited to sit a medical as yet.
- 1.13 Mr Armstrong was notified in a letter of his failure to pass the knowledge test and that the matter would be considered by the Committee. The letter explained he could submit a letter in support of his application which would form part of this report. A copy of a letter in support of his application has been received and a redacted version is attached to the report.

2. Recommendation

It is recommended that Members consider the terms of the report.

The options available to the Members are:-

- 2.1
- (a) to refuse to grant the TAXI DRIVER licences in terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, Section 13 (5) on the ground that the applicants, having failed to pass the knowledge test, have failed to satisfy the Authority that they had adequate knowledge of the area to which the licence relates; the layout of roads in the area and of the Council's licence conditions; or
- (b) to give the applicants a final opportunity to take and pass the knowledge test, and should the applicant fail the knowledge test, to authorise the Chief Governance Officer to refuse the applications without further reference to Committee in terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, Section 13 (5) on the ground that the applicants, having failed to pass the knowledge test, have failed to satisfy the Authority that they had adequate

knowledge of the area to which the licence relates; the layout of roads in the area and of the Council's licence conditions;

(c) if Members are satisfied that there are other relevant circumstances that warrant a departure from policy, to instruct officers to arrange for the applicants to undertake a medical; and should they fail the medical to remit the matter back to Committee for consideration; should the applicants pass the medical, to authorise the Chief Governance Officer to grant the TAXI DRIVER licences.
