AGREED to **RENEW** the licence for a period of one year together with a warning letter and subject to the standard conditions.

CL69. APPLICATION FOR THE RENEWAL OF A LATE HOURS CATERING LICENCE

The applicant, Mr A, entered the meeting.

There was submitted Report (circulated) dated 29 December 2010 by the Acting Director of Law and Administration Services on an application for the renewal of a late hours catering licence (a) advising of the background to the application; (b) detailing the consultations undertaken and the responses received; and (c) attaching as appendices the late hours catering policy, the late hours catering conditions and a location plan.

Mr A spoke in support of the application.

Questions were then asked by Members of the Committee.

In light of the submissions made, **AGREED** that a departure from the Council's policy was justified in this case and therefore to **GRANT** the late hours catering licence subject to the standard conditions.

CL70. APPLICATION FOR THE RENEWAL OF A LATE HOURS CATERING LICENCE

The applicant, Ms A, entered the meeting together with her brother, Mr A.

There was submitted Report (circulated) dated 29 December 2010 by the Acting Director of Law and Administration Services on an application for the renewal of a late hours catering licence (a) advising of the background to the application; (b) detailing the consultations undertaken and the responses received; and (c) attaching as appendices the late hours catering policy, the late hours catering conditions and a location plan.

Ms A spoke in support of the application, advising that a 1.30 a.m. terminal hour was sought only on Saturday and Sunday mornings and not for every day of the week as set out in the report.

Questions were then asked by Members of the Committee.

In light of the submissions made, **AGREED** that a departure from the Council's policy was justified in this case and therefore to **GRANT** the late hours catering licence to 1.30 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday mornings only and to 12 midnight on all other days of the week and subject to the standard conditions.

CL71. APPLICATION FOR THE GRANT OF A NEW PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE

A representative of the applicant company, Mr L, entered the meeting.
