Try writing an acrostic poem about litter. An acrostic poem uses the letters in a word or name as the beginning of a word or line that will tell you something about that person or topic.

Here is an example:

If I were to write an acrostic poem about being "muddy" it might go like this,

My mum doesn't like me playing in the mud.

Usually she gets angry.

Don't think she likes all the washing.

Don't think she understands,

You have so much fun playing in the mud.

Rubbish limericks

Try writing your very own rubbish limerick. A limerick is a fun poem that is funny and short. You have to try and make the last words of the first, second and fifth lines rhyme with each other, and the last words of the third and fourth lines rhyme with each other. Limericks also tend to have a rhythm to them, see the example below:

There was a wee lady from Bo'ness,
Who was fed up with litter and mess.
She did a litter pick,
which cleaned up just the trick.
And her pictures all over the press.
