

Do you want to kick-start your career with a combination of quality work experience and nationally recognised training? Falkirk Council is looking to build on our current successful Training Programmes by recruiting enthusiastic people for a variety of occupational areas.

To apply you must be:

- A resident of the Falkirk Council area
- Currently unemployed or work less than 16 hours
- Aged 16 - 24 years (some older clients may be eligible to take part, if unemployed, as your JobCentre Plus Advisor)

Falkirk Council will be recruiting throughout the year and currently have career opportunities in the following:

Paul McLaren began his journey with ETU back in 2014, starting on a bespoke warehousing programme, so he had already declared a definite interest in this type of work.

In his first few months of working with ETU, Paul completed a whole range of certificated training including the Falkirk Employability Award, manual Handling Awareness and a National Progression Award in Supply Chain operations.

He moved into a work experience opportunity with Storage UK and quickly integrated himself with the team there; demonstrating clear ability and a desire to learn more. Paul's hard work paid off as, at the end of his initial training period, he was offered a job opportunity at Storage UK, with an SVQ Level 2 Warehousing & Storage. In November 2016, Paul's achievements were recognised when he won Falkirk Council's Apprentice of the Year, Level 2.

Keen to secure an opportunity within the building industry from a young age, Lee secured a work experience opportunity during his 4th Year at Grangemouth High School with a local plumbing company.

During this time Lee was able to gain new skills whilst in a real work environment, confirming his decision to secure a Modern Apprenticeship on leaving school. In August 2014, Lee successfully completed Falkirk Council's recruitment process, resulting in the offer of a four year Plumbing Apprenticeship.

Combining a full working week with college attendance Lee is successfully progressing his training, so much so that Lee was a finalist in the 2016 Scottish APSE Apprentice of the Year awards.
