

Examples of Additional Conditions for Occasional Licences.

The law sets out conditions that are attached to an occasional licence. These are known as **mandatory conditions** and must be complied with.

In some cases, the Licensing Board may attach **additional conditions** to an occasional licence if they consider it appropriate to protect the licensing objectives. If additional conditions are applied to your licence, this will be discussed with you before your licence is issued.

Below are examples of additional conditions that the Board may apply.

	Examples of Additional Conditions
1.	Children and young persons must be accompanied by a responsible adult
2.	Children and young persons (aged *-* years) are permitted entry provided they are part of the entertainment and are accompanied by a responsible adult. They are required to leave after the entertainment has concluded.
3.	A noise limiting device designed to cut power when predetermined noise levels set by Falkirk Council Environmental Health Team are exceeded, is to be operational for the duration of the function.
4.	All live music to be routed through the noise limiting device as detailed in the additional condition above.
5.	Adequate stewarding by persons who hold a licence granted under s.8 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001 must be provided during the event.
6.	A personal licence holder to be present throughout the duration of the event
7.	All drinks must be decanted into non-glass drinking vessels.
8.	Access only permitted to season ticket holders who have pre purchased a ticket for match day hospitality
9.	CCTV footage of the licensed area is to be retained for 30 days to allow it to be viewed by Police Scotland and/or the Licensing Standards Officer if required.
10.	Admittance by ticket or invitation only
11.	The occasional licence will be operated in accordance with the Alcohol Management Plan
12.	Any person suspected of consuming alcohol prior to the prom will be refused entry by the licenceholder.

13.	Wristbands will be used to identify attendees that are aged under 18.
14.	The outdoor drinking area will be clearly delineated with barriers.
15.	All staff who sell or serve alcohol must either hold a Personal Licence or have received the same training as is required of staff in licensed premises. The Personal Licence or training record must be produced to the Licensing Standards Officer on request.
