Title: Early Learning & Childcare (ELC) – 1140 Expansion Plan

Update

Meeting: Education, Children and Young People Executive

Date: 23 March 2021

Submitted By: Director of Children's Services

1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1 This report provides the Education, Children and Young People Executive (ECYP) with:
 - an update on progress with the Early Learning and Childcare (ELC) Expansion Plans;
 - updated information on the Scottish Governments announcements on the Temporary Restrictions Fund, the Deferred Places Pilot and Progress Reports;
 - additional information on the next phases and proposals to expand early intervention support;
 - proposals to increase capacity to meet anticipated growth in demand for statutory places; and
 - an update on the overall financial position.

2 Recommendations

2.1 Education, Children and Young People Executive is asked to:

- (i) note the overall content of this update report;
- (ii) note the updates provided on the remaining projects as detailed in Appendix 1;
- (iii) agree the proposals outlined in Sections 4.3.2, 4.3.3, 4.3.4 regarding the progression of the of early intervention strategies;
- (iv) note the early intervention pilot project and next phases as outlined in Sections 4.3.5 and 4.3.6;
- (v) note that Children's Services Officers will be responsible for the administration of the recently announced Temporary Restrictions Fund (TRF) as outlined in Section 4.4;
- (vi) agree to the proposal, regarding increasing statutory place capacity as detailed in Section 4.5; and
- (vii) note the financial position as detailed in Section 6.1 and in Appendix 2.

3. Background

3.1 **National Context**

Following the Scottish Government's decision to move to an August 2021 implementation date for the delivery of 1140 hours provision, a number of key decisions have also been made to progress several separate workstreams:

- Deferred Place Pilot;
- introduction of Temporary Restrictions Fund; and
- Improvement Service Progress Report Updates.

Further information on these are contained in this report.

3.2 Local Context

Officers from Children's Services and Development Services continue to liaise with contractors, sub-contractors and Planning Teams to progress the remaining work projects.

In addition, Officers have been considering how the Covid situation, in particular, financial and economic insecurity and poverty, could affect future demand for statutory ELC places.

4. Considerations

4.1 Remaining Projects – Update

- At the time of writing this report 1 project has been fully completed and it is expected that another 2 will be fully completed by the time the EC&YP Executive meet.
 - St Francis PS (Completed)
 - Nethermains PS (Due to complete March 2021)
 - o Parkhill ELCC (Due to complete March 2021)
- In summary, 18 projects remain on-going of which 4 of them relate to minor or external landscaping work.
- Full details of these projects are contained in Appendix 1.

4.2 Deferred Places Pilot

• Following the selection of the 5 local authorities, including Falkirk that will form the Year 1 pilot, from August 2021, the Scottish Government have established a small working group to oversee, assess and review local authorities' experiences and challenges in Year 1.

4.3 Progress Update – Developments to Support Early Intervention & Prevention

- The impact of the pandemic (COVID-19) has impacted negatively on key groups and communities resulting in more families meeting the eligibility criteria for benefits which, in turn, increases the demand for early learning and childcare places for two-year olds.
- Officers from both Education and Children and Families divisions have developed a proposed plan to increase the delivery of early intervention and prevention services targeted towards families of young children through a series of phases which are aligned to the Closer to Home Strategy and the principles of GIRFEC.

4.3.1 Phase 1:Support for Learning Assistants (Agreed)

Recruitment is underway with the planned implementation date of August 2021.

4.3.2 Phase 2: Proposal -Targeted Family Support and Positive Parenting

- This proposal involves the creation of a small dedicated team of 3fte Family Support Workers who will focus on and deal specifically with ELC referrals.
- Initially, it is intended to seek interested volunteers from internal advertising, enabling the existing Family Support teams to move into this new ELC focussed team
- It is envisaged that, if approved, this team will be an integral part of an overall conjoined and enhanced early intervention approach to providing parenting and family support to those children and families that require it.
- This phase will form part of Children's Services planned re-design of the overall Family Support Service as part of the Closer to Home strategy. A separate report on this will be presented to the EC&YP Executive at a future Meeting.

4.3.3 Phase 3: Proposal - Increase the Capacity for Eligible 2-Year Olds

- Officers expect that as a result of the financial and economic insecurity caused by the current Covid position, there will be a consequential increase in the number of families that will meet the qualifying criteria for a statutory 2-year old place.
- Whilst Officers will keep a close watch on the expected increase in demand against available capacity, it is important that where opportunities arise to increase such capacity, that they are proactively captured.
- From August 2021, as part of the agreed planned expansion, capacity for 2-year olds was due to be increased by 15 places:
 - Kinglass ELCC, Bo'ness 15 places (new establishment)
 - To meet the expected growth in demand for these places, it is proposed to further increase capacity by 15 places by undertaking some internal works at Langlees ELCC.
- These developments will increase the total capacity across Falkirk settings for 2-year olds from August 2021 to 294 places.

4.3.4 Phase 4: Proposal - Prioritisation of Available Baby Places to Meet Statutory Need

- Across the ELC estate, there are currently 7 ELCCs that have 57 baby places.
- All of these places are currently used by families who pay for non-statutory childcare.
- This proposal seeks to re-prioritise 27 of these places across the estate <u>over a period of time</u> for the purpose of providing statutory early intervention and prevention support for very young children who are referred by Health or Social Work as being deemed to be at risk or vulnerable.
- This would mean that across the 7 ELCCs baby places would be re-prioritised as:

- If approved, Officers would re-prioritise these places but only as and when the current fee-paying places are vacated. No one who currently has a baby place will be displaced.
- This would be kept under review during the course of the academic session 2021/22 and further updates on this will be reported to EC&YP Executive.

4.3.5 Future Phases

- Officers plan to consider the following areas of potential support and service provision over the next few months:
 - o Community Childminders; and
 - Psychological Services

Proposals around these areas will be brought to a future meeting EC&YP Executive once they have been finalised.

4.3.6 Pilot Project - Single Point of Contact for Initial Referrals to Social Work

- As part of the early intervention funding already agreed by EC&YP Executive, work has already commenced on a pilot project that involves supporting the creation of an Initial Response Team (IRT) within Children & Families.
- The IRT aims to provide a single point of contact for all new referrals of concern, to ensure timely responses and a dedicated resource to provide effective child protection responses and early help for families in need.
- This team would ensure that the appropriate information gathering and assessments are undertaken with the appropriate Officers, underpinned by a Getting It Right for Every Child (GIRFEC) approach across Schools, Early Years Establishments, Social Work Localities and Specialist Teams to ensure that all referrals are properly and professionally assessed, logged and correctly signposted.
- This team will consist of an additional 4 x Social Workers supplemented by management support.
- This IRT pilot project will be evaluated as part of the Closer to Home strategy.

4.3.7 Costs of Early Intervention Proposals

It is expected that the overall revenue costs associated with the proposals for Phases 2, and the IRT Pilot Project can be funded from the £450k previously agreed by the EC&YP Executive to be allocated to support Early Intervention Strategies.

The capital costs associated with the proposal associated with Phase 4 can be met from existing capital resources.

4.4 Temporary Restrictions Fund (TRF)

- The Scottish Government recently announced a further package of £3.8m of financial support for all private nurseries and out of school care providers for each 4-week period that they remain open to provide childcare to support key worker and vulnerable families.
- Falkirk's share of this funding is £80,000 plus a £2,000 administration fee.
- Claims close for the first 4 weekly period (Mon 4 Jan Fri 29 Jan 21) on 1 March 2021.

- The payments will be fixed based on the registered capacity of each establishment. They range from £575 to £ 2,800.
- In a similar manner to the process adopted for the Transitional Support Fund (TSF), local authorities will be responsible for receiving and assessing applications and making the payments as agreed via COSLA.

4.5 Improvement Service Progress Report Updates

- As part of their regular information gathering exercises, the Improvement Service have recently confirmed that local authorities will be asked to submit details and data relating to their ELC1140 progress between March 2021 and April 2022.
- The 1st Progress Report is due to be submitted by 15 March 2021.

4.6 Workforce Update

- At 16 February 2021, the ELC Sector showed a total of **658 fte**.
- These figures do not, as yet, fully reflect the additional workforce decisions agreed by the EC&YP Executive in January 2021.
- A summary of the current ELC workforce structure is attached as Appendix 3.

5. Consultation

5.1 Officers will continue to consult with appropriate stakeholders including parents, trade unions and colleagues working on the Strategic Property Review as required as the Expansion Plans continue to be developed and rolled out.

6. Implications

Financial/Resources

6.1 Summary of Current Years Financial Position (2020/21)

<u>Note</u>: The above funds are both ring fenced therefore carry forwards can be made.

Legal

6.2 Current plans have been developed in recognition of the relevant Statutory Guidance that has been issued in relation to the Early Years Learning and Childcare Duties within the Children and Young People (Scotland) Act 2014.

Risk

- 6.3 The key inherent risks associated with this major project are:
 - delivery of infrastructure expansion projects on time;
 - ensuring that planned expenditure is kept in line with resources;
 - ensuring we have sufficient staff recruited on time;
 - potential disruption to the supply chain as a result of price inflation or non-availability of materials linked to Brexit;
 - the potential impact that any current or future COVID/lockdown decisions may have on all aspects of the overall expansion plans; and
 - Officers are considering and reviewing contingency plans in liaison with external providers.

Equalities

- 6.4 The current plans for early intervention strategies aim to provide more targeted and prioritised support to those children who have additional support needs and strengthen the interface and linkage with vulnerable families.
- 6.5 The proposals to realign existing and future capacity to increase the number of statutory place available directly supports those families in most need and augments and underpins the equalities agenda.

Sustainability/Environmental Impact

6.6 All project infrastructure work has been developed in a way that supports and enhances the quality of our school estate. Many aspects of this work have also augmented and improved energy efficiency targets and our overall aim to meet national climate change ambitions, this has included the replacement of older buildings.

7. Conclusions

7.1 As the expansion project enters its final and most challenging and exciting phase, several of the larger projects will now start to evolve and take shape on site. Whilst the reopening of the ELC sector is welcomed, the Covid position means that contractor's progress may be restricted by the operational and on-site health and safety guidance that applies. Officers form both Children's and Development Services will continue to liaise with the contractors and the local ELC establishments and schools to ensure that any challenges that may arise are dealt with positively and rapidly.
