## Report to Council Baillie Buchanan and Councillor McNally

#### Fracking: The Debate on Hydraulic Fracturing for Gas

#### Mermaid Conference Centre, London, 19 May 2014

Below are bullet points and notes that we made which we thought were of interest to this Council as intimated at full Council on 14 May 2014.

In the first instance an apology is due from Councillor McNally in that the opportunity to present the local Community Charter to the table as promised, never materialised, but Climate and Energy campaigner, FoE Tony Bosworth, was aware of the contents and indeed of the people involved when we had a discussion on the Charter at an interval in the proceedings.

- Claims and counter claims on jobs and amount of money injected in local economy were so diametrically opposite from each other.
- These ranged from 62.000 jobs created nationally to 3 per pad, = 1 local job.
- £32billion per annum was claim from Dan Byles MP Chair of all party group on unconventional oil and gas.
- He has no hesitancy in declaring he has been in contact/discussions with multi national petroleum companies.
- The 14<sup>th</sup> licensing round at Westminster later this year will give clear indicators the Barometer, of interest to exploration in these wells.
- There is a clear need for all exploration to be very well regulated, such are the possible hazardous outcomes to the local areas. (see Tindell Report).
- The Westminster govt are going to alter the law on trespass in England to allow the interested companies to drill without notification, or put CPO in place, stated that these plans for wells should be "normalised" like any planning application.
- Not enough effective community engagement was admitted on "artificial community benefits" bribes was the word used by chair (Roger Harrabin) to appease communities, i.e. put a new roof on local hall.
- The E.U is split on this process.
- France Germany Canada don't allow fracking, <u>Centrica Total EDF</u>, have licences here but not in their home countries.
- Impression is confirmed that big companies are driving this.

- Will fracking lower energy bills; no one claimed that.
- Will it be economic saviour see Ernst and Young report on overstated gains, all exaggerated
- Real evidence from USA/Australia on harm to environment why? Not enough information on consequences.
- Summary, need to improve alternative energy supplies.
- Lord Howell brought into the debate, GEORGE OSBORNES father in Law, his statement, "There will be Fracking" this is a must read/ Google for info on WINDSOR ENERGY GROUP to see where political pressure is coming from, enlightening and clear for anyone to see where vested interests rest.
- Lots of stats and research from OPINIUM RESEARCH, and from University of Nottingham, little outcome only more uncertainty on public perceptions, surveyed 29.000 to ask what is Fracking,
- However the water contamination risk was linked with shale gas extraction and the process is not seen as a clean energy.
- The Wells themselves in the manner in which they are constructed and the waste that emerges ,on
  how this waste radioactive water is dispersed causes concern to DR Jim Marshall policy advisor
  Water UK.
- In Scotland terms, we have a reputation of pure water for <u>any</u> chance of pollution to our Whisky making, industry, mountain, spring water, crop and cereal growing to consider.
- The conclusion again on the surveys was one of an emerging picture but not enough robust evidence available to allow these wells to proceed, too many don't know long term implications.
- Andrew Austin, C.E O, of IGAS, asserts councils should have confidence in the Environment agency, health and safety, to protect and ensure that this industry is safe, regulatory bodies are the best in the world.
- However he did state that there is a clear need to get this right, to bring communities and regulators together on any future development and that FUTUREOLOGY is what it is.
- When asked by chair if D.C and G.O had been "helpful" on Govt intervention, the answer was they had created tax incentives to the companies interested!
- Will it bring down prices? Probably not implication is that there would be less need to import from abroad, this was obviously to make the case for shale gas.
- Prof John Loughhead, UK Energy Research Centre, stated Scientific evidence is scanty, on Hydro Carbon, we need more information on overall environment impact.

• Dr Jim Marshall, too many possibilities, magnitude of risks is unclear still uncertainty of impact on water companies and doubts on how to treat the waste effluent /make safe. And issues on Public Health.

#### Own conclusions:

- We should be in no rush to develop this form of extraction until all possibilities have been fully investigated.
- Have an in house seminar with invited relevant parties.
- Proper consultation with the Scottish Govt on the Independent Scientific Panel review reporting on unconventional oil and gas that we believe is ongoing at present.
- There is no doubt that there are too many conflicting opinions and reports.
- Our doubts lie with the ability to regulate this process effectively at this time.
- The absolute need to engage and listen to the views and concerns of local communities.
- These are of course the views of local councillors, no experts it has to be said, but as members of the planning committee and of course the decision makers, we appreciate the opportunity to attend this conference and be better informed on the strengths and weaknesses in this Fracking coal bed Methane extraction process.

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Scotland will commemorate the centenary of the First World War during 2014-2018 by recognising the broad impact of war on our country and the Scots. Activity is to be coordinated with those in the UK and beyond. National commemorations will encompass local, national and international dimensions and will encourage coordination and collaboration between Scottish delivery bodies. A key outcome will be developing a lasting legacy across generations which recognises the impact of the war on families and communities.

#### 2. THE SCOTTISH COMMEMORATIONS PANEL

- 2.1 In March 2013 the Scottish Government appointed The Scottish Commemorations Panel to support Scotland's commemorations. The panel comprises of representatives from the military and veterans communities, community leaders, clergy, media, historians and education specialists from across Scotland.
- 2.2 The panel have recommended the following key dates to be marked during the centenary;
  - August 2014; Outbreak of WW1. Among other commemorations, including a Commonwealth ceremony in Glasgow, a drumhead service will be held on the esplanade at Edinburgh Castle, replicating the church services staged on the front line that used neatly piled drums for impromptu alters;
  - 25<sup>th</sup> April 2015; Gallipoli; The allied naval and military operation to force the Dardanelles and so secure entry to the Black Sea and to the then capital of Turkey, Istanbul. The 52<sup>nd</sup> Lowland Division, including many Scottish Battalions took part in the later stages of the campaign;
  - 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2015: The train crash at Quintinshill, near Gretna: The Leith based 7<sup>th</sup> Battalion Royal Scots, Territorial Force were on their way to Liverpool for Gallipoli and lost 214 Officers and men; 246 people, mainly soldiers were injured;
  - 25<sup>th</sup> September 2015: Battle of Loos. Part of the first Allied offensive in Artois and Champagne. Half of all casualties were Scottish and five VC's were awarded to Scots, including an award to piper Daniel Laidlaw, who braved poison gas and gunfire to play his company forward;
  - 31<sup>st</sup> May 2016: Battle of Jutland. The only time that British and German dreadnought battleships came to blows. Both sides claimed victory the Germans lost fewer ships and men but the British claimed victory as Germany never again seriously challenged British control of the North Sea during WW1;
  - 9<sup>th</sup> April 2017: Battle of Arras. A concentration of 44 Scottish Battalions and seven Scottish-named Canadian battalions attacked on the first day in the largest concentration of Scots to have fought together during the war. One-third of the 159,000 British Expeditionary Force casualties were Scottish;

- 11th November 2018; Armistice Day and celebration of peace; and
- 1<sup>st</sup> January 2019; Loss of HMS Iolaire. The Iolaire was carrying many naval personnel returning home to Lewis from Kyle of Lochalsh when she struck rocks half a mile from Stornoway with the loss of 204 of the 285 men aboard.
- 2.3 Further research will no doubt reveal Falkirk connections to many of these events during WW1 such as the train crash at Quintinshill involving a train that had been travelling from Larbert to Liverpool on 22<sup>nd</sup> May 1915 and commemorated on a wall plaque within Larbert Railway Station.
- 2.4 Given the coordinating role of the Commemorations Panel it has been agreed that each Local Authority appoint an officer who will be the single point of contact with the panel and advise on any local activity as well as receive information fro Scottish Government with regard to the significant dates as outlined at paragraph 2.2 above.
- 2.5 CMT have agreed that the officer responsible for collation of the information and be named individual for purposes of Scottish Commemorations Panel will be Caird Forsyth, Policy Officer. Each directorate has been asked to nominate an officer who will collate any known activity made known within their area of work. The collated information would be available to Scottish Government/Scottish Commemorations Panel and our communities.

#### 3. FIRST WORLD WAR VICTORIA CROSS RECIPIENTS

- 3.1 In December 2013 the council were advised that from August 2014 the UK Government will be commemorating recipients of the Victoria Cross in the First World War across UK with specially commissioned paving stones that are to be laid in the birthplaces of the recipients. There are two recipients of the Victoria Cross during WW1 who were born in the Falkirk area;
  - Samuel Frickleton awarded on 7<sup>th</sup> June, 1917 for action at Messines, France born Slamannan
  - Harcus Strachan awarded on 20<sup>th</sup> November 1917 for action at Masnieres, France – born Bo'ness
- 3.2 Local authorities are to be responsible for the placing of the stones in consultation with relatives and local communities. The paving stones are to be placed in communities on or about the anniversary of the award.
- 3.3 Interest in this scheme has been registered with Scottish Government.

# 4. FALKIRK ARMED SERVICES COMMUNITY COVENANT GROUP (FASCCG)

- 4.1 The FASCCG formed after signing of the Falkirk Armed Services Community Covenant in August 2012 is chaired by Falkirk Veterans Champion, Depute Provost John Patrick meet on a regular basis and part of the business of the group is to consider applications for Armed Forces Community Covenant Funding as well as any activity involving veterans in the area. At the most recent meeting of the group members were advised of the following activity proposed to mark the anniversary of WW1;
  - Preparation of a booklet by an officer within SPS Polmont providing information on WW1 including local people awarded Victoria Cross. Booklet is to be circulated within SPS Polmont and to local schools during 2014/18. An application to Armed Forces Community Covenant Fund has been made to cover costs of printing.
  - A proposal by Officers from SPS Polmont to carry out a sponsored walk in aid of Poppy Scotland. The walk is to be carried out over 100 miles in Belgium and France visiting war graves and finishing at the Menin Gate on 10<sup>th</sup> August 2014. Officers are seeking sponsorship and assistance with transport for this event.
  - Proposal to create a wild flower meadow, including poppies, at Forth Valley Royal Hospital by NHS Forth Valley. Hope to involve local school children with this as well as Criminal Justice Community Service with the heavy digging of the plot.
  - Creation of memorial garden at site of Falkirk Royal; Infirmary now Falkirk Community Hospital where railings and a plaque commemorating pupils of Falkirk High School who lost their lives in WW1 are to be restored and reinstated. Hope to involve pupils of Falkirk High School in this project.
- 4.2 Given the period of commemoration there may well be more activities being planned within the area not least annual services of remembrance within many of our communities throughout the period. Membership of the FASCCG will be asked to keep the group updated of any planned activity.

#### 5. CONCLUSION

5.1 There is no doubt that the period 2014/2018 will see a number of activities being planned within the Falkirk Council area in commemoration of WW1 and will range from educational to community activity and not all will be centred around the key dates provided by The Scottish Commemorations Panel as shown in paragraph 2.2. The proposed action should ensure that Council are informed of commemoration activity.

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Reserved places are calculated annually for the purpose of determining how many places can be made available for Placing Requests at each primary and secondary school.

#### Legislation

Reserved places are defined in Section 28A(c) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1980 as follows:

"'reserved places' means such number of places (not exceeding such number or, as the case may be, such percentage of places at the school or relating to the particular stage of education as may be prescribed by regulations) as are in the opinion of the education authority reasonably required to accommodate pupils likely to become resident in the catchment area of the school in the period from the time of consideration of the placing request up to and during the year from 1 August to which the placing request relates; and different numbers or, as the case may be, percentages may be prescribed under this subsection for the purpose of different cases or circumstances."

In summary, this means that the Authority can reserve a reasonable number of places in each year group, at each school, as required for the coming/current school session only.

#### 1.2. Falkirk Council Admissions Policy

The Falkirk Council Admissions Policy (November 2012) states that Education Services can refuse Placing Requests on the grounds that vacant places (where they exist) are reserved for children that are likely to move into a school catchment during the forthcoming or current school session.

#### 1.3. <u>Methodology</u>

The methodology for calculating Reserved Places was detailed in the report to the Education Committee in January 2012. In summary, the formula for calculating reserved places for each year group is as follows:

<u>Reserved Places</u> = 'Number of catchment pupils on the waiting list' + 'Estimated places required for new housing' + 'Estimated places required for pupils moving into the area'

- 1.4. Placing requests are not normally granted where they would take up places reserved for pupils that are likely to move into the school catchment during the coming or current school session. The pupils living in the catchment area that are waiting for a place at a school are also added to the Reserved Places total.
- 1.5. This report provides the detailed Reserved Places List that has been calculated for the 2014/15 school session.

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Based upon the outcome of a competitive tendering process, a contract for safety checks and servicing of domestic gas appliances in the Bo'ness, Braes, Grangemouth and Stenhousemuir areas was awarded to City Technical, Cambuslang.

1.2 This Bulletin report provides information on the outcome of a benchmarking exercise for the undertaking of safety checks and the servicing of domestic gas appliances for Council Houses in the Camelon, Dawson, Denny and Falkirk areas.

#### 2. BENCHMARKING EXERCISE

- 2.1 The Council's Building Maintenance Division (BMD) has since May 2008 undertaken safety checks and servicing of domestic gas appliances for all council housing across the Camelon, Dawson, Denny and Falkirk areas. This arrangement was scheduled to end on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2014 and in order to determine whether BMD should continue to deliver the service a detailed benchmarking exercise was undertaken.
- 2.2 This benchmark was a rigours examination of BMD's costs and quality against the winning bid provided by City Technical (see 1.1 above). The Benchmark therefore challenged BMD's price competitiveness and through an examination of their proposals, also assessed the quality of service delivery.

#### 3. EVALUATION

#### Price

- 3.1 An independent benchmark price was calculated with reference to the rates submitted by City Technical. The benchmark price is based upon a recent competitive tendering exercise and is considered challenging and competitive.
- 3.2 The price submitted by BMD was £729,005 which is within 1% of the benchmark price. BMD will deliver approximately £37,000 in efficiencies from their current rates, therefore delivering real financial savings for the Council.
- 3.3 Notwithstanding the marginally higher rate from BMD it is considered the Council benefit from a continued mixed delivery in this key area of service. These benefits include maintaining in-house expertise to respond to emergency situations or interruption in supply from the private sector, supporting local employment/training and that income generated supports wider delivery of key BMD operations.

#### Quality

3.4 Analysis was also carried out over a broad range of non financial factors, including staffing levels, health and safety and customer care. It was evident that BMD are a quality driven service built around strong compliance to best practice and clear ambitions of seeking continuous improvement including sustaining high levels of customer care.

#### Conclusion

3.5 Considering the price competitiveness of the BMD proposal, securing of savings to the HRA and confidence in the continued delivery of a quality service it is concluded that awarding the work to BMD for the servicing of domestic gas appliances for all council housing across the Camelon, Dawson, Denny and Falkirk areas would provide Best Value to the Council.

#### 4. ACTION TAKEN

4.1 In accordance with Standing Order 5.2, I accepted the tender from Building Maintenance Division for the sum of £729,005 per annum, for the Safety Checks/Servicing of Domestic Gas Appliances for the Camelon, Dawson, Denny and Falkirk areas for an initial 3 year period from 1<sup>st</sup> May 2014 to 30<sup>th</sup> April 2017 with an option to extend for a further 12 months to 30<sup>th</sup> April 2018.

1.1 This report is for the Purchase of In Cab Technology (on board computers), for the Council's fleet of refuse collection vehicles.
