# The Return of Mission: Possible!

Some teachers may recall a food safety project, Mission: Possible!, which took place at selected Falkirk schools between 2007-10. 1,000 more pupils can now take part! Each primary school within Falkirk Council will shortly receive an email asking if they would like to participate and places will be offered on a first comefirst served basis on reply to that email. So what is it all about?

Mission: Possible! is a food safety project aimed at children around **P5**. The project was first launched by Wyre Borough Council as part of a local food hygiene initiative. It was so successful (97% of teachers rated the project very good or excellent) that the evaluation. The cases can then be Food Standards Agency adopted it and offered it to 50 Local Authorities throughout the UK. We were one of only six Scottish Authorities and the project ran within Falkirk Council at 22 before the project start date. schools covering about 900 pupils.

#### What does it involve?

We need the teachers of the P5 pupils to be keen to participate.

We have a total of 55 black Mission: Possible! cases available for the pupils. Each case contains a colourful commitments. workbook with Training Exercises, Mission Tasks and Agent Information Notes; fridge/freezer thermometer; plastic spoon; sample bags; digital thermometer; ruler-calculator; torch; and a pen. Pupils get to keep some of the contents of the case at the end of their Mission. The case itself and some of the equipment is passed on to the next school.

During the Mission, schools are given an ultra-violet hand viewing cabinet

with "glowgerm" gel; a large magnetic fridge poster with magnetic food items; a teaching pack containing a full "mission briefing", a USB microscope and a CD ROM with the introduction presentation. The CD ROM also contains a certificate template and forms. A template letter to parents is also included.

Our Missions will start at each school on a Monday. This would allow work in class with the teacher (the 10 Training Exercises) at the beginning of the week. The children take the cases home to complete the homework returning them on the Friday for follow-up work and prepared ready for pick up to be passed on to the next class or school. A teacher's case, CD-Rom and Teacher's Guide will be delivered

The project is led by the class teacher but the Environmental Health Officer may be able to visit to talk to the pupils about the project and/or food

safety, depending on other work

Some of the comments after our last project:-

From a parent: "I thought it was a really brilliant idea for myself and my daughter to do this project

together. We had fun doing it and it was very informative. She has learned something that she will always remember. I hope she brings home more projects like this".

### Hippodrome and FTH - screenings for schools and nurseries



# Information about changes to household waste collection

Falkirk Council is changing the way it collects household waste to help increase recycling. The new service involves green bin collections moving from every two weeks to every three weeks. The communities of Bo'ness, Lionthorn, Upper Braes, Denny, Bonnybridge and Banknock are the next areas to receive the change of service.

All other recycling collections remain the same with food waste being collected every week and the blue bin, brown bin, black box and textile bag every two weeks.

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Falkirk Council Contract Standing Orders require that competition is used to demonstrate fairness, transparency and deliver Best Value. The use of "Quick Quotes", the online quotation facility on Public Contracts Scotland website is the recommended approach to secure an appropriate level of competition into the procurement process for contracts below a value of £50,000.
- 1.2 The purpose of this report is to advise Members of the contracts awarded by Chief Officers through "Quick Quotes" during the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2014 to 31<sup>st</sup> August 2014. Details of the contracts are attached in Appendix 1.

#### 2. RECOMMENDATION

2.1 Members are asked to note in accordance with Standing Order 6.2(i), the contracts awarded through Quick Quotes as outlined in Appendix 1.

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 In April 2008 the Scottish Government entered into a contact with Idox Software to supply, as part of the ePlanning Project, an online information system, an electronic document and records management system (EDRMS), scanning software, scanning workstations, additional monitors and associated servers - this was classed as the OPIS strand of the project. The Council inherited the contract signed by the Scottish Government and the Falkirk Council User Agreement ended on the 27th May 2013.

1.2 The end dates for all other elements of the ePlanning project, and the contract for the casework management system which integrates with them, expired at various dates in the first half of 2014. However we also reviewed the contracts for these products in the context of best value and the potential cost of purchasing a new casework management system.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 In September 2012 approval was granted to enter into an extension to the Scottish Government negotiated contract for the OPIS strand.
- 2.2 A corporate project is underway to investigate the use of an EDRMS. However this is at the early stages and a project plan had not been developed.
- 2.3 The existing EDRMS and Development Management Public Access System are closely integrated with the casework system currently used within Planning and Building Standards. We own the casework system and are not in a position to purchase a new one as the cost of going to the market for new products, the unlikelihood of an alterative being available, and the potential disruption to service delivery are prohibitive. Consequently the existing EDRMS and Public Access System, which are closely integrated with the casework system, provide the best solution at this time.
- 2.4 Owing to the uncertainty of timescales for the implementation of a corporate EDRMS solution, continuing with the use of the existing EDRMS within Development Services provides best value to the Council at this time. It is not yet known if the corporate project will provide a solution for Planning and Building Standards.

- 2.5 A binding quote at a reduced rate for all planning authorities who participated in the ePlanning project was received from the supplier and is based upon an initial discount of 25% below the existing fixed annual cost for the first year with the annual inflationary increase capped at 2% for up to five years.
- 2.6 We have negotiated the same terms for a contract of three years with an option to extend for two one year periods thereafter. This allows for a review should the corporate EDRMS project be implemented within the five year period.
- 2.7 This contract falls under the Contract Standing Orders, Section 5. Exceptions to Competition clause 5.3, as the supplier of the product does not permit maintenance by a third party.
- 2.8 This contract also falls under the Contract Standing Orders clause 5.7, as the maximum cumulative contract value of £47,097.87 falls within the Council threshold of £50,000. The previous ePlannng cost was £12,067pa. The values under the new contract are £9,050.25 for the first year rising to £9,796.28 in year five, thus demonstrating a useful saving.

3.1 In view of the above contract analysis, and in accordance with standing orders 5.3 and 5.7 relating to contracts, I have entered into a contract for an additional period of three years with an option to extend for two one year periods, thereafter.

1.1 In April 2008 the Scottish Government entered into a contact with Idox Software to supply, as part of the ePlanning Project, an online information system, an electronic document and records management system (EDRMS), scanning software, scanning workstations, additional monitors and associated servers - this was classed as the OPIS strand of the project. In addition, the Scottish Government provided a system for the online submission of planning applications which was launched in April 2009.

1.2 Falkirk Council's ePlanning project extended beyond the scope of the Scottish Government project and included the provision of facilities for Building Standards which matched those of the ePlanning OPIS strand plus an online submission facility, ie eBS. Following the successful implementation of the OPIS strand, work commenced on the delivery of eBS. The products were implemented in stages: September 2010 the EDRMS category; July 2011 the BS Register; and March 2013 the online submission facility.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 eBS was purchased in 2009 at a capital cost of £45,000 with a £9,000pa cost for maintenance and support upon completion of delivery. Cost to 31st March 2014 was just under £64,500.
- 2.2 In April 2013, we entered into a fixed term contract for the ePlanning OPIS products for a period of up to five years with the annual inflationary increase capped at 2% pa. We negotiated the same terms for the eBS products for a period of two years with an option to extend for two one year periods thereafter. This brings the eBS contract into line with the replacement ePlanning OPIS contract and allows for
  - a review should the corporate EDRMS project be implemented within the term on this contract, and/or
  - the Scottish Government online building standards submission system is launched during the term of the contract, or
  - integration of the two contracts should this prove beneficial to the Council.
- 2.3 This contract falls under the Contract Standing Orders, Section 5. Exceptions to Competition clause 5.3, as the supplier of the product does not permit maintenance by a third party.

2.4 This contract also falls under the Contract Standing Orders clause 5.7, as the maximum cumulative contract value of £37,094.47 falls within the Council threshold of £50,000. The cost for 2013/14 was £9,000pa and has been maintained for the 2014/15 year with a 2% increase each year thereafter. Under the new contract the values are £9,000 .00 for year one rising to £9,550.87 in year four.

The Council's current consultancy services term commission was entered into with Mouchel Ltd on 6 July 2012 for an initial duration of two years with a possible extension of up to a further two years.

1.2 The purpose of this report is to advise Members that the term commission has been extended for a further two years until 8 July 2016.

#### 2. DETAILS

- 2.1 The term commission takes the form of a 'call-off' contract over a fixed period of time to provide roads, transportation and environmental related engineering and professional services. The purpose of this 'partnering' arrangement is to augment the Councils' inhouse professional services capabilities and expertise, to address increases and peaks in workload and to retain flexibility of resources.

It is also used to hold the Falkirk Council corporate address gazetteer (CAG). It is supplied by Idox and has been used by the Council since 2003, originally under a 7 year contract. Since then, from October 2010, the Council has entered into periodic maintenance and support contracts for the Uniform system with Idox.

- 1.2 As part of the Scottish Government ePlanning project, which went live in 2009, an online information system and an electronic records and document management system (OPIS) were supplied to Falkirk Council. These products are integrated with the Uniform application.
- 1.3 In May 2013, Falkirk Council entered into a new contract for up to five years for the support and maintenance of the OPIS products referred to in section 1.2 which were supplied by the ePlanning project.
- 1.4 An online information and application submission system used by Building Standards is also integrated with the Uniform application.
