## **2 Appeals Committee**

- 2.1 As explained in the previous report the officers of the Board are currently reviewing its policies and procedures in particular in regard to the grievance and appeals process. While the current procedures are fit for purpose in most circumstances the review will provide an opportunity to clarify procedural matters. It would be prudent, notwithstanding the review, to establish an Appeals Committee. It is suggested that the membership of this is 3 members comprising the deputy convener and one member each from the constituent authorities.

## **3. Clerk**

- 3.1 The Board is, in terms of the Order, required to appoint a clerk. This post has, since the Board was established in 1996, been filled by the senior governance officer within Falkirk Council. The previous clerk, Rose Mary Glackin, left Falkirk Council in March 2017. It is recommended that her successor as Chief Governance Officer, Colin Moodie, is confirmed as clerk to the Board.
