1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1 This report provides the Education, Children and Young People Executive (ECYP) with:
 - an update on progress with the Early Learning and Childcare (ELC) Expansion Plans;
 - updated information on the Scottish Governments announcements on the new date for the implementation of 1140 hours and on Deferred Places;
 - additional information on proposals to expand early intervention support;
 - an update on the overall financial position.

2 Recommendations

- 2.1 Education, Children and Young People Executive is asked to:
 - (i) note the overall content of this update report;
 - (ii) note the updates provided on the remaining projects as detailed in Appendix 1;
 - (iii) note that Falkirk have been selected as a pilot authority to progress the Scottish Government's planned changes to the Deferred Place legislation (Section 4.2);
 - (iv) agree the names of the new ELC Centres as proposed in Section 4.3;
 - (v) agree to the proposed changes to the Support for Learning Assistant DSM allocations as detailed in Section 4.4;
 - (vi) agree to the proposal for an additional Support Officer post as detailed in Section 4.5.

3. Background

3.1 <u>National Context</u>

The Scottish Government have now advised they will restart the statutory requirement on local authorities to deliver 1140 hours from August 2021, having previously placed that requirement "on hold" due to the COVID position.

3.2 Local Context

Following the Scottish Government's confirmation of the revised August 2021 implementation date Officers from Children's and Development Services have been liaising extensively with the main contractors to update and finalise timelines for the remaining work projects.

4. Considerations

4.1 Update on Outstanding Projects

 At the time of writing this report work is on track to complete the expansion works at a further 4 projects:

St Francis PS – planned opening Jan 21 (capacity 64)
 Laurieston PS – planned opening Jan 21 (capacity 64)
 St Margaret's ELCC – planned completion Feb 21 **
 Nethermains PS – planned completion Feb 21 **
 Note - ** establishments currently delivering 1140 hours.

- In summary there are 21 projects that have still to be completed.
 - 15 are larger work projects
 - o 6 are minor work projects
- Full details of these projects are contained in Appendix 1.

4.2 Deferred Places

- Further to the information outlined in the 8 December 2020 report the Scottish Government have now confirmed on 16 December 2020 that Falkirk has been selected to be one of the 5 pilot local authorities who will be assessing the roll out of the planned changes to the legislation from August 2021.
- Additional funding for this pilot workstream will be provided once it has been ratified by COSLA's Settlement and Distribution Group (SDG).

4.3 Naming of New Early Learning and Childcare Centres

- In line with previous practice Officers have been consulting with parents and Local Members on the preferred options for the new names for the undernoted ELCC's:
 - (i) Moray PS / Oxgangs proposed name is Abbotsgrange ELCC.
 - (ii) Maddiston PS proposed name is Glendevon ELCC
 - (iii) St Margaret's PS proposed name is Parkhill ELCC

4.4 Supporting Early Intervention and Children with Additional Support Needs

• EC&YP Executive has already agreed to deliver a comprehensive approach to Early Intervention for children and their families, therefore, insetting support for children with additional support needs is a key element of this approach.

- The first part of this strategic plan work-stream has been completed and proposes enhancing the level of core SFLA resource across all of our 39 ELC classes. Further work will be undertaken to consider how best other support teams including Family Support can be aligned to further enhance the early intervention support that is provided.
- Falkirk's ELC expansion strategy has created both new and additional support level posts, namely ELC Assistants and Support for Learning Assistants. This has supported the delivery of a refreshed workforce to deliver the expanded hours in a way that supports both children's needs and parental choice.
- Given the successful approach taken to early and phased implementation of 1140 hours since August 2018; and, with the experience of having ELC Assistants working in settings, Officers now have a better and more acute level of understanding as to what is required further by way of investment to deliver sector-leading services.
- Learning from staffing models that are in place in each of our 13 ELCCs shows that motivated and well-trained SFLAs provide crucial support to children where there is a known additional need. This can include delivering programmes of support provided by health and other professional staff groups and working with children and families to assess and gather information that allows children's needs to be better understood and profiled. This supports and allows other practitioners, managers and social work teams to make more informed decisions on relevant support plans.
- The undernoted table summarises the proposed changes to the Devolved School Management (DSM) formula with regard to enhancing the SFLA allocations:

- If approved then the current core DSM weekly hours of 530 will be increased by 370 additional weekly hours. This will create additional hours for some staff and also some additional new posts which would be recruited in February 2021.
- The estimated additional full year cost of this is c£0.560m and has been included in our financial and budget assessments.

4.5 <u>Central ELC Support Team</u>

- Following the confirmation that Falkirk has been selected to be a pilot local authority to support the implementation of the new Deferred Place legislation it is proposed that a new Support Officer post is created within the Team.
- If approved this will allow the existing Team to realign and will also allow for additional support to be provided for the families of eligible 2 year olds.

• This post (Grade E) will cost c£30k pa. The funding for this post will come from the expected increased quantum of revenue funding once the funding for the Deferred Place pilot has been confirmed.

5 Consultation

5.1 Officers will continue to consult with appropriate stakeholder including parents, trade unions and colleagues working on the Strategic Property Review as required as the Expansion Plans continue to be developed and rolled out.

6 Implications

6.1 Summary of Current Years Financial Position (2020/21)

Legal

6.2 Current plans have been developed in recognition of the relevant Statutory Guidance that has been issued in relation to the Early Years Learning and Childcare Duties within the Children and Young People (Scotland) Act 2014.

Risk

- 6.3 The key inherent risks associated with this major project are:
 - delivery of infrastructure expansion projects on time;
 - ensuring that planned expenditure is kept in line with resources;
 - ensuring we have sufficient staff recruited on time;
 - potential disruption to the supply chain as a result of price inflation or nonavailability of materials linked to Brexit;
 - the potential impact that any current or future COVID/lockdown decisions may have on all aspects of the overall expansion plans; and
 - Officers are considering and reviewing contingency plans in liaison with external providers.

Equalities

6.4 The removal of snack charges for parents within our early years establishments also support and furthers the aims and ambitions of the Council's Poverty Strategy - Towards a Fairer Falkirk 2019-2024.

This project also provides additional support for those children who have disabilities.

Sustainability/Environmental Impact

6.5 All project infrastructure work has been developed in a way that supports and enhances the quality of our school estate. Many aspects of this work has also augmented and improved energy efficiency targets and our overall aim to meet national climate change ambitions, this has included the replacement of older buildings.

7 Conclusions

- 7.1 As the Scottish Government has now confirmed the new statutory date for the implementation of 1140 hours is August 2021, it gives Officers sufficient time to consider alternative or contingency options that can be provided to parents for 1140 hours provision for those larger scale projects that are scheduled to be completed from August to December 2021.
- 7.2 Officers are delighted that Falkirk has been selected to be one of 5 pilot authorities that will implement the Scottish Governments planned changes to the Deferred Places legislation from August 2021, two years ahead of the national scheduled implementation date.
