LB60. Exclusion of Public and Determination of Form of Hearing

LB62. Declarations of Interest

LB63. Minute

LB64. Application for Grant of a Premises Licence

The Board considered a report by the Clerk to the Licensing Board which provided details of an application made in terms of section 23 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 for the grant of a premises licence for Glen Village Store, Glen Crescent, Glen Village, Falkirk.

The Board heard from the applicant, Mr Ponpandian, in respect of the application and in clarification of questions raised by members.

Decision

The Board granted the application for a premises licence.

LB65. Applications for Non Minor Variations to Premises Licences

The Board considered a report by the Clerk to the Licensing Board which provided details of applications made in terms of section 30 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 for the non minor variation to the following premises licences, namely (1) Sainsbury's, Glasgow Road, Denny; (2) Sainsbury's, Kinnaird Village, Larbert; (3) Petrol Station, 235 Kilsyth Road, Banknock, and (4) Scotfresh, Unit 3, Fleming Court, Denny.

(1) Sainsbury's, Glasgow Road, Denny

The Board heard from Mr Hassard, the applicant's agent, who requested a continuation of the application to the next meeting to allow the Board to be provided with an updated Home Delivery Policy in respect of the application.

Decision

The Board agreed to continue the application to the next meeting at the request of the applicant's agent.

(2) Sainsbury's, Kinnaird Village, Larbert

The Board heard from Mr Hassard, the applicant's agent, who requested a continuation of the application to the next meeting to allow the Board to be provided with an updated Home Delivery Policy in respect of the application.

Decision

The Board agreed to continue the application to the next meeting at the request of the applicant's agent.

(3) Petrol Station, 235 Kilsyth Road, Banknock

Decision

to change the alcohol display area resulting in an increase in capacity from 8.61 m³ to 11.07 m³.

(4) Scotfresh, Unit 3, Fleming Court, Denny

Decision

The Board granted the following variations to the current licence, namely:-

The addition of the following to the list of other activities:-

- the premises will be open from 6am
- the sale of hot food to take away
- home delivery services including the delivery of alcohol.

LB66. Personal Licence - Notification of Conviction
