## CL57. APPLICATION FOR THE GRANT OF A PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE

With reference to Minute of Meeting of the Civic Licensing Committee held on 19 November 2008 (minute CL54 refers), there was submitted Report (circulated) dated 14 November 2008 by the Director of Development Services on an application for the grant of a public entertainment licence to operate a Paintball business within Loanfoot Wood, Bonnybridge.
