CL16. MINUTE

AGREED:-

- (a) that, in light of the applicant's intimation at the Committee of his difficulty with written tests, the applicant be given a final opportunity to take the knowledge test orally and to pass it, and subsequently to provide evidence that he has passed the Council's medical test;
- (b) thereafter to remit to the Director of Development Services to grant the application for a period of 6 months subject to the standard conditions;
- (c) that, should the applicant fail either of the knowledge or medical tests, to authorise the Director of Development Services to refuse the application without further reference to Committee; and
- (d) that in the event that the licence is granted and a renewal application subsequently made, the application should be referred for determination by Committee.
