PQ gave a review of PC Lorimer's report:-

presented the report highlighting 53 calls to the police over the last period, 9 reported crimes, mostly minor or domestic issues and antisocial issues. The incident at Ercal road would appear to not be repeating, tho patrols are still active in the area.

Sunnyside farm (derelict) is attracting youths, patrols are on going.

Road traffic & parking offences are being caught, fines issued. Take heed.

Park Gardens	Cllr Hughes will enquire if a pavement can be laid at front of no4.
Bank	Cllr Hughes advised BofS own the land. Property agents has changed.
Road accident	freedom of info stats are to be sought from emergency services.. Ongoing PQ
Standrigg Rd	Persimon homes at top of Standrigg Rd will go to public meeting.
Station Road	Dot Reid and Raymond Smith to be asked about notification of Utilities work procedures so that we are advised in advance of any planned works.
Muiravonside Estate	additional meeting been held by Falkirk Community Trust
Fly Tipping	Cllr Hughes requested a survey – which ironically concluded little litter in this instance.
Lamp Post replacement	in Ercall road are taking a while to complete and some are squint. MH advised the same issues in Randolph crescent., so works likely to be ongoing.
BCC Environment	A left over £5 from the Quarry Park path project is to be donated to charity
Randolph Crescent burn	Large trees are overhanging and potential dangerous. FDC to be contacted.
